The video, [posted to YouTube](#) by user Charlton Mcleod, shows the semi truck submerged nearly to its windows on Highway 15 in Sumter as it is filmed from a car on the opposite side of the highway.

A child in the car labels the driver "big and bad" for daring to drive through the deep water.

"If he makes it, I give him all the credit in the world," a woman's voice says.

The semi appears to make it out of the deep section of highway and drives away on comparatively dry land.

Central South Carolina is experiencing [widespread flooding](#) from record rainfalls.

Gov. [Nikki Haley](#) dubbed the precipitation a "1,000-year level of rain."
